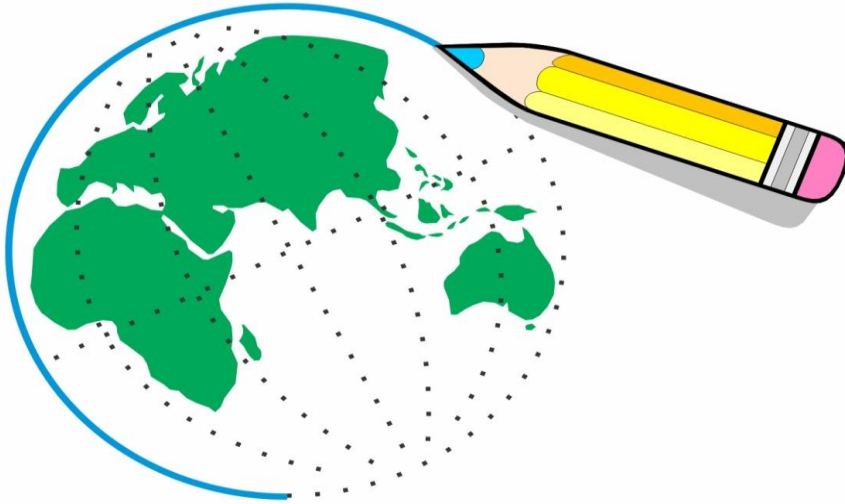

1. **Best Practices on the Ground**

Barbara Fullerton now serves in congregational ministry, applying what she learned over nearly twelve years as Stewardship Development Program Minister in The United Church of Canada. How did stewardship practices she suggested to congregations work out in real life? What has she learned on the ground? Presented by **Barbara Fullerton**, Intern Supply Minister, St. Paul's United Church, Paris, Ontario, and former Stewardship Development Program Minister for the United Church of Canada.

2. **Stewardship with a Twist!**

Join me as we consider playful and creative ideas that present stewardship with enthusiasm, opportunities for congregational wide participation, and even a little healthy competition. Stewardship is a great time to have fun while fostering a deep sense of value, pride and commitment to your ministry. Now that's a twist! Presented by **Brenda Watt**, a stewardship animator, educator and facilitator who does consulting work with Congregations, Presbyteries and Conferences throughout Western Canada. She is also having a blast serving in full-time ministry at Crossfield United Church, just 20 minutes north of Calgary.

3. **Using Godly Play**

4. **Stewardship at the EDGE**

A missional shift suggests that the church refocus on those on the fringe, or outside of the church all together. We will explore how to use social value trend data to engage people in your community to make a difference with their lives and their money for a better community and world. Social value trend data from the most recent Environics survey will be explored.
